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
Grand Hotel: Preserving History and Preparing for the Future

Located on a small island on the Straits of Mackinac, Grand Hotel has been a beloved summer destination since 1887. The hotel boasts 388 rooms, each designed in their own unique style. Mackinac Island is a summer town, with only 600 year-round residents maintaining the island. On top of the harsh winters, the island has outlawed cars – preserving their old-world charm but adding complications to any construction needs.

Case & Associates was tasked with updating the bathrooms, 100-year-old Esther Williams Swimming Pool, and their vast retail spaces. Location, weather, and more added to the complications of this project. However, with experience, collaboration, and a pinch of luck, we were able to complete this project on time and on budget.



The beautiful and historic town has one unique aspect that both charms and brings visitors back to the hotel's first days - there are no cars allowed. Foot, bike, and horse-drawn carriages are the only modes of transportation. While this no doubt adds to the charm of the island, it also provides some unique challenges for contractors providing much-needed renovation.


The Task at Hand

The renovations of Grand Hotel included the total renovation of all guest bathrooms, updates to the pool and pool house, and improvements to the retail and public spaces.

Because of the age of the hotel, the plumbing was different from room to room. This meant that every bathroom had to be modified on the fly. We were prepared for this, and the challenges associated, but there was only so much preparation that could be done until our team got in and made the necessary updates.

Grand Hotel celebrated the 100th anniversary of the Esther Williams Swimming Pool during the 2021 season. Our renovations ushered in more excitement and room for relaxing.



Finally, the renovations to the retail spaces allow Grand Hotel to provide an all-inclusive experience for visitors. Whether guests need a cup of coffee or a new swimsuit to show off by the pool, visitors can feel confident they will have everything they need while staying on Mackinac Island. These updates allowed Grand Hotel to invest in more varied income streams while providing a great vacation experience.



Unique Challenges for a Unique Venue

To preserve the beauty and history of Grand Hotel, we were faced with a few very unique challenges, including:



Time Limits

Grand Hotel was a large-scale project that had to be completed during a specific time. Mackinac Island is a tourist destination, popular during the summer. As a result, all renovations had to be completed during the off-season. Any projects that were not completed in time for the summer season would need to be finished the next winter - on our dime. Because of this, we were incredibly cognizant of the project schedule. The locals thought we would never be able to pull this off. The inspector said we'd never get it done in time. We are happy to share - that was not the case.

Winter in a Summer Town

There are only 600 year-round residents who live on Mackinac Island and only two restaurants open in the winter. On top of that, we were faced with the cold Michigan winters. If we didn't have enough rebar for a project, we couldn't drive down to the local hardware store - all equipment and raw materials had to be ferried in or flown in on an 8-seater plane when the lake was frozen over.

Hiring workers for a location during the off-season can be a challenge - especially during COVID. Our dedicated team was not able to grab a beer after work at the local bar because they were following social distancing requirements.

We also could not rely on sourcing any materials or equipment on the island. This meant we had to ferry or fly in all raw materials and equipment - including 2 concrete trucks.



Below Freezing Temperatures

The daily average temperature while working on this project was below freezing. This provided some unique challenges for our team. We purchased 8 snowmobiles for our managers to move around the property more freely. We also provided a budget for our employees to buy warm weather clothes. Being headquartered in Texas, many people on our team were not prepared for weather like this.

For 6 weeks, the lake was frozen over, and we were not able to ferry over supplies. We had to rely on a small 8-person plane to bring in any materials – including rebar. We then used a horse and buggy to bring supplies to the job site.




Finally, we needed to figure out how to lay the concrete in below-freezing temperatures. When the weather is too cold, the concrete won't set. To avoid this, we kept the bags of concrete under a large heating pad, used the heating pad to warm up the ground, and then finally, used the **heating pad on top of the poured concrete to help it set**.
